MAKER MAJLIS INITIATIVE


QGBC SUSTAINABILITY AWARDS | DOHA | MAR 4



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The Masters Short Term Study at Oxford to advance our thesis was an unparalleled experience. The experience benefited myself as an aspiring researcher.... We had access to library resources from the immense Bodleian Libraries; professors, students, and areas of research pursued at Oxford University; and a different learning environment altogether in which we engaged with a parallel culture of discussion, exchange, openness, and humility in seeking knowledge.

At Oxford, I explored Islamic perspectives on predictive medicine, looking into critical questions such as how Predictive Medicine challenges the theological and philosophical concepts like human agency and free will; to what extent does it blur the boundaries between longestablished dichotomies like health and sickness; and reconceptualization of Islamic traditional institutions like family and marriage through this lens. I was fortunate to engage with and present my research to professors who were experts in theology and philosophy, and gain valuable feedback in turn on how to continue shaping my thesis.
